FOXRIDGE CIVIC ASSOCIATION GENERAL MEETING MARCH 26, 2014

The General meeting of the Foxridge Civic Association was called to order by President Jim Warfuel at 7: 00 pm.

Present were:

The Treasurer gave the financial report stating that the current account balance was approximately \$5,437.24. He stated that to date the current percentage of residents that have paid membership fees is 13.57%.

The Secretary gave the report from the January General Meeting to include the election of officers.

The President stated the following Association goals for 2014:

Maintenance of Palm Trees & Islands Maintenance and upkeep of Neighborhood signs and surrounding areas with seasonal decorations and plants.

The president called upon Membership Committee member Bob McDermott to report on the ongoing membership drive and the block reps status. Bob reported that there were currently 26 block reps and 38 blocks yet to be covered. Membership drive signs have been placed strategically throughout the neighborhood.

New Business:

The following issues were discussed:

- Newsletters
- Increasing Membership
- Recruiting Block Reps
- Membership Drive
- What the Association can and cannot do

The president also stated that the Foxridge neighborhood is not a deed restricted community. Therefore, there are no <u>mandatory</u> fees. He also stated that the Association had no Code Enforcement authority. He added that any issues should be referred to Clay County Code Enforcement.

The President introduced County Commissioner Doug Conkey who gave an overview and status of the County's financial budget and obligations and the impact on the community in general. He also gave an overview of road projects in progress and placement of red light cameras.

The president introduced Det. Tim Frazho, of the Clay County Sheriff's Office Community Relations Section. Det. Frazho gave a public safety report stating that out of 365 days there were 739 false calls. Of the 739 calls, 40 were concerning home alarm systems, 86 were property checks, 7 were reporting suspicious persons, 10 were reporting suspicious vehicles, 10 were burglaries and 1 was reporting a peeping Tom. He also stated that there was a County curfew for youngsters under 18. From Sunday through Thursday, the curfew is 11 PM, for Friday and Saturday, it is 1 AM. At the conclusion of his report, there was a Question & Answer period.

Pizza and drinks were provided at the end of the meeting.

The meeting was adjourned at 8:40 pm.
